Minister's Letter

It is Ezekiel who leads our thinking this month. In chap 16 we find the culminating words at verses 62—63. My choice of 'leading' or leads' as it is above, is evident in the events of these two verses and perhaps useful for us as we come to contemplate the mysteries, wonder and sacrifice of Good Friday and the beauty of Easter Day.

⁶²I will establish my covenant with you, and you shall know that I am the LORD, ⁶³in order that you may remember and be confounded, and never open your mouth again because of your shame, when I forgive you all that you have done, says the Lord GOD..

As humans we get caught up in the seeming contradictions involved in Easter. How can Good Friday be good when Jesus is crucified? For Luther, that great continental Church reformer, God's character is not found in mysterious, unworldly, absolute distance from us, but in his self-willed costly proximity to us. God is other than us because God loves .. loves each person without ulterior motive, unreservedly, unconditionally.

Some of our problem is our modern tendency to skim – skim everything – TV channels, games we can pick up and put down, magazines over books, emails over hand-written letters, data bases over gleaned wisdom from experience, idiot-guides over in-depth learning.

We, as Christians, are called to be different from the surrounding culture – we are called to take time, to see the person, to study the Word, to make space and listen for God, to see God in others. In church we are not brought up in a culture of making a quick sale for Christ, a 3-second impression, a sound-bite news point. It may well still be that a good beginning and a good ending to the sermon are the most important points! But the journey of faith and life is a long-haul, like learning for life, it's the bit in between that matters! The German theologian Bonhoeffer gave us the answer long ago – if we want quality then we need to invest time and effort, all our senses, overcoming prejudices, invoking all our powers of concentration. It's the long haul, the slow incline where most of us find faith. In other words Easter will only be Easter if it is Good News. And vitally it is only Good News if we see it through the lens of Good Friday.

Every Sunday is taken as a mini resurrection day celebration. Now at Easter we can follow the whole event and realize for ourselves the full joy of sins forgiven and the hope of eternal life.

Church Membership: Martha and Barney

Lawrence's request to transfer their membership

from Buxton was agreed and we look forward to receiving them into membership. Sadly Dene Brownlee has decided to resign her membership as she feels St Andrew's is no longer the right place for her. We reported on the annual church return to Synod that we had 66 church members at 31st December and an average congregation during 2013 of 50.

2015: we agreed to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the dedication of the church building with a series of special events and services during the year. It will include a service led by the Moderator of General Assembly, Rev David Grosch-Miller. If you have ideas for events or would like to help, speak to Ian Gordon or Dorothy Graham

Resources: The renovation of the manse kitchen and installation of the new boiler are now complete and John and Ann thanked the church. Having investigated the leaks through the Michael Room roof, Mike Warburton reported that Robert Lee had made arrangements for the roof to be repaired and estimates sought for total replacement. Estimates are also being sought for completion of the interior redecoration of the church and for external paintwork. The vestry window and firedoor will be replaced shortly. (This was done in mid-March.) The Treasurer reported that the balance in the church account was around £13,500, but there will be large

bills for premises repairs during the coming year. The meeting agreed that the focus of the Gift Day Appeal would be the premises.

Helen Lidgett is to be the new Synod Clerk

As most of you know I was elected Clerk of the URC East Midlands Synod at the Synod meeting on 15th March. It is a voluntary post and is for three years from 2014 – 17, with the option of a further three years. For the next 6 months I am shadowing the present Synod Clerk, Duncan Smith, and will take over at the October Synod.

As Clerk, I will be responsible in consultation with the Moderator for preparing Agendas for meetings of Synod (twice a year) and the Synod Enabling Group (four times a year) and working with the Synod Administrator on arrangements for Synod and Synod Enabling Group meetings. I will meet with the Moderator at least once a fortnight to discuss relevant Synod business. I am an ex-officio member of all Synod Groups (there are 10!) and a Trustee of the Synod Trust. I am part of the Office Management team which is responsible for running the Synod office in Nottingham and have some line management responsibilities. I will be available to

advise local churches and will attend inductions and area meetings. I will represent the Synod at Synod Clerks' meetings, General Assembly and other URC meetings.

It is a wide-ranging post and I have told Elders and Church Meeting that I must therefore stand down as Church Secretary at the AGM in July. But I am not leaving you! I will be in church most Sundays, as much of the Clerk's work is on weekdays, and will continue to contribute as far as I am able to the life and mission of the church. St Andrew's matters to me, it is where my Christian roots are and your love and joy and encouragement sustain me. Please pray for me and for Patrick as I start yet another phase of my Christian journey.

REV BARRY F. JONES

Older members of St Andrew's and Holymoorside will be saddened to hear of the death after a long illness of Barry Jones.

Barry came to the joint pastorate in the autumn of 1991, having previously served in Northampton and Rochdale. He, with his wife Delia and their son Adam, were the first occupants of the new manse which had just been erected in the church grounds.

During his ministry a 'Mum and Tots' group was established, where young mothers living in the neighbourhood could meet in the Church Hall for coffee and a chat, the toddlers being looked after by ladies of the congregation. Another innovation, prompted by Delia, was a craft group - an enterprise which has been resurrected by our present minister's wife, Ann.

Unfortunately much of Barry's time with us was clouded by ill-health, and a decision was made in 1996 that he should take early retirement.

In the pulpit Barry was an effective preacher, with a clear message which he was eager to deliver. As his elder, I remember him for his sense of humour, and for the courage, sustained by a deep Christian faith, with which he faced his illness. On retirement he and Delia moved to Northampton, where sadly further health

problems intervened. Throughout his prolonged terminal illness he was devotedly cared for and supported by Delia.

Barry's funeral was at Abington Avenue URC, Northampton, on 14th March. Our thoughts and prayers are with Delia and her family at this time.

Barbara's Synod Report

Terms of Settlement: Each pastorate should carry out a review of the terms of settlement every 4 years, but preferably every two years alongside the Ministerial Accompanied Self Appraisal. We should review our mission every four years through the Local Mission and Ministry Review, asking the question "Where are we?" A data base has been drawn up to help each church decide where they want to be.

Rev David Dean is now the Synod resource on interfaith issues. He is available for churches to use.

Deployment: With regard to ministerial deployment Synod is still over deployed, but as the national target figure reduces every year so it is more difficult to reach.

Environment: Christian Aid is having a campaign on world emissions of carbon dioxide.

Finance: the average giving needed for the Ministry and Mission Fund is £347 per person, nearly £7 per week. If we could all give 1% more to M&M it would help to meet the deficit. Synod voted to give £19,000 to the URC Ministers Pension Fund to help meet the Regulator's requirements.

Back to Church Sunday: it was suggested that we invite people to five services through the year including Harvest, Remembrance, Advent and Christmas. We are asked to open our churches on November 11th to allow people to pray for peace.



Mission Development: The new Mission Strategy can be found on the Synod website: www.urch5.org.uk. People are invited to make comments about the new strategy.

There was a talk by Francis Brienen, Deputy General Secretary for Mission on Vision 20/20. A grant of up to £1000 can be allocated towards a mission outreach project. Details are on the URC website: www.urch.org.uk

Elders: The Ministries Group notes the hugely valued work and gifts that Elders offer. The Elders should be responsible to choose which preachers to invite. Elders meetings should include reflection on their responsibilities as set out in The Basis of Union.

Helen Lidgett was elected Synod Clerk for 2014—17.

The Bible passage is Psalm 118

Faith is sometimes expressed as a journey, more rarely as an adventure! Yet it reads like an adventure storybook. The excitement of journeys into the unknown, the tussle with Pharaoh, the outspoken prophets, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, the pushing of the boundaries by Paul, each one is an exciting adventure in God's way of living.

Our Lent journey this year, at least on Sundays, is based on five leaps of faith and excitement in the Old Testament: the dawn of human creation and humanity's place in the order of God's world; the call of Abram; the Israelites journey in the wilderness; the anointing David to be king; God's promise to the exiles that they will be restored.

As we now approach Passiontide and Easter we can ask the question, "Who is this?" And the answer will come in five revelations: Jesus is God's only begotten Son; Jesus fulfils the Old Testament prophesies and shows he is God's Messiah; Jesus reveals God to all who will look and see; God is true to himself restoring a Davidic King through Jesus; Jesus is the one who was Rejected but has become the cornerstone of eternity for all who

will follow.

That brings us back to the beginning and Abram stepping out in faith, doing as God asked and being told that in himself all the families of the earth will be blessed!

And you? You live it out every day that you follow Jesus, every day that you acknowledge God in your life, every day that you make your confession, every day that you hope for eternal life, and every day that you take that first and next step of the journey. What must it be like not to have hope through Christ's resurrection? I cannot say. But it must be daunting to think the end of this life is the end of everything.

Jesus proved it was not! Resurrection happened – as attested by the disciples and the many people that saw him alive after his death. In amazing trust he told his friends what would happen. They disbelieved. He was vindicated by God raising him from death. He is vindicated every day that you believe, every day that you find your sins forgiven and through your celebration of Easter's joy.

May God bless to you his Easter joys!

North Derbyshire Cluster Report

13 people from 7 churches met at Calow on 10th February. The Group discussed arrangements for the Cluster Service on Palm Sunday and made plans for future meetings.

Rev Camilla Veitch, Pastoral Consultant for Derbyshire and minister of West Derbyshire URC in Wirksworth, explained that Synod wants to hold area meetings throughout the Synod so people from local churches can meet together, share news, discuss important issues like the Ministry and Mission Fund or deployment, and share together in worship. The Moderator would like to attend at least one meeting in each area during the year. The Group agreed to hold a meeting at 7.30pm on Wednesday 18th June in Wirksworth to explore issues coming to General Assembly, which will be in Cardiff in early July. This will be for everybody, not just Cluster representatives.

Rev Steve Fisher reported that Buxton has agreed to be a 'Hub' for Youth and Children's work and will be available to the churches in Derbyshire.

The church representatives shared news. Good news stories included the call of Rev Rosemary Solomon to Rose Hill and Calow, the lease of the Eastwood Hall at Rose Hill to Chesterfield Studios, the development of regular 'Messy Church' services in Tideswell in cooperation with the Anglicans which is bringing new

people into the life of the churches, the expansion of the lunch club in Buxton so they need to run two sessions and West Derbyshire's plans for Friday morning 'tea and toast' sessions for parents returning home after leaving their children at school.

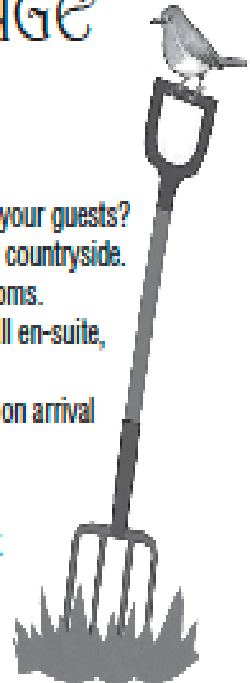
